I have to state that a foraging party
of our men were attacked on their return
road from a mill, in Tenn, and two killed
and some wounded I cannot re-
member their names I was with two
companies at the time at a town on
Duck river The killed were brought
in the next day and they with the
wound were sent to Nash Ville
immediately, to be cared for the names
of any of them I do not recollect I sup-
pose that I gave the wounded some
treatment
