March, 1863 in Co. C - 1 2nd Tenn Mounted Infantry

in the War of the Rebellion, and served at least ninety days, and who was honorably discharged at Nashville

Tenn on the 10 day of April, 1865 That he

was born at North Carolina about the 19th day of October, 1826

That he is wholly unable to earn a support by manual labor, by reason of Wounds from

gun, wound in foot, old age - 72

years, and feebleness

Claims increase pension

That he has not been in the military or naval service of the United States otherwise than stated above

That he has applied for pension under application No. 334 774 at \$8 - per month

That he makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension roll of the United States under the provisions of the act of June 27, 1890. He hereby appoints with full power of substitution and revocation,

1. All who are wholly or partly disabled from doing manual labor by any permanent disability contracted before, during, OR SINCE THE WAR, (not the result of vicious habits) or from old age, can surely succeed under this new law, if they served ninety days or more and received an honorable discharge.
2. The rates under this Act, are graded from \$5 to \$12, proportioned to the degree of inability to earn a support by manual labor.
3. Those who have applied under the old law, and those who get a less pension than \$12 per month under the old law, may apply under this New Law and avail themselves of any additional rights. (This being supplementary legislation.)

The Act of June 27, 1890, REQUIRES, in case of a soldier:

1. An honorable discharge (but the certificate need not be filed unless called for).
2. A minimum service of ninety days.
3. A permanent physical disability not due to vicious habits. (It need not have originated in the service).
4. The rates under the act are graded from \$6 to \$12, proportioned to the degree of inability to earn a support, and are not affected by the rank held.
5. A pensioner under prior laws may apply under this one, or a pensioner under this one may apply under other laws, but he cannot draw more than ONE pension for the same period.
