Sir in answer to your inquiry I have to say I remember treating the within named soldier at Gleyton he the said J. C. Montgomery was sent on a scout with others & was accidentally shot by the discharge of one of his Comrades guns the ball entered near the instep passing down and coming out in the hollow of the foot it so injured the muscle as to cause a partial stiffness of the Ankle joint I treated the Case for 6 or 8 weeks before he was able to walk without the help of Crutches he got able to do Lite duty this was in the Summer of 1864 I treated him til he was mustered out of the service which was in the Spring or Summer of 1865 when I think the wound was healed but tender and he had partial Anchlosis of the Ankle joint it was weak he was lame since then I know nothing of him
