Case of James E. Montgomery, No. 380,524

On this 15th day of May, 1886, at Leesburgville, County of Leesburg, State of Pennsylvania, before me, F. W. Gallbraith, a Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared Hocerton Roberts, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid pension claim, deposes and says:

I have known the claimant James E. Montgomery ever since he was a small boy; I was with him in the same regiment until I was in the 6th Penn. Cav. Cos. E & G. I was 3^d Sgt.

I know him to be the man who was in Co C, 2^d Penn Inf. Infantry.

I know he cannot walk. I have heard stories about his having been shot before the war. I never heard such stories before he applied for a pension. I lived a close neighbor to him and I advised with him before he enlisted or rather he did with me, as both sides were trying to get up volunteers. I know he was

ual shot before the war. I never heard anything about him having received any reward before this war until I heard he had applied for a pension. I have lived in this County ever since 1845. Montgomery is a man of good reputation.

I have no interest in his case and have no bias or prejudice for or against him and am up to his.
