nothing of my own personal knowledge and will
agreed with Clement Knobell he knew him before
the war and since the war I am told by some
of the members of the 6th Regt Indiana Cavalry well that
J. G. Montgomery was a camp follower of
that Regt for a time and then came
here and was at home bush whacking
then went to the 2nd Indiana Mounted Infan-
try stayed there some time in the spring of
1864 then left the Regt in company with
some of the Regt to go on a Raid on them
and on account and went to a house of
ill fame about 15 miles from the Regt
got into a fight with some Rebs guerrillas
Montgomery received a wound in the foot
went back and then joined the Regt or is
listed for 12 months after he was shot in
