Q Describe the course of the wound.

A The bullet struck me on the instep and came out between the heel & the hollow part of my foot.

Q Have you ever related to any one that you were engaged in a scuffle at a still house and were accidentally shot by one Base Mogan.

A No sir I never have.

Q How soon after you were wounded did you return to your company.

A I came back as I have related and was treated by Dr Hogle while I was in the company quarters. When the company moved I was moved into it.

Q With whom did you mess and bunk while you were in the Army after you were shot.
