On this 17th day of March, 1885, at
Maquette, County of Leveque
 State of Tenn, before me, Alb Galluath, a
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared
James Greenway, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of afore-
 said pension claim, deposes and says:

My name is James Greenway, I expect
 I am about sixty years old. I live
 near Maquette Leveque Co Tenn and
 I am a farmer.

Q were you ever in Co B 2^d Penn
 Abt 1864.

A Yes sir, I was in that in 1864.

Q Do you remember a man in
 the same company, and regiment
 named James G. Montgomery.

A Yes sir I do.

Q Do you remember whether or not
 he was ever wounded while
 you and he were in the
 regiment.

A Yes sir I think I do.

Q were you with him when
 he was wounded.

A I don't think I was.

Q Can you remember how or where it was said he was wounded.

A My understanding was that it was at a house kept by a woman named Brown; that was the talk.

Q Can you now remember who said so.

A No sir I don't know that I can.

Q Do you remember the month or year that he was wounded.

A I rather think it was in the spring of 1864. I don't remember the month.

Q Have you stated all you remember about the matter.

A I believe I have.

Q Have you any interest in this claim or in its formation.

A No sir.

Q Have you any bias or prejudice for or against the claimant.

A No sir.
